## A. Sola Scriptura

- 1. What it is "not"
  - a. Not the claim that the Bible contains all knowledge
  - b. Not the claim that the Bible is an exhaustive catalogue of religious knowledge
  - c. Not a denial of the authority of the church to teach truth
  - d. Not a denial that the word of God has been a spoken word
  - e. Not a rejection of every form of tradition
  - f. Not a denial of the role of the Holy Spirit as Interpreter
- 2. What is sola scriptura?
  - a. Scripture is the sole infallible rule of faith
  - b. Scripture contains all that one must believe to be a Christian
  - c. Any religious claim not found in Scripture is not binding
  - d. Scripture reveals all things essential for salvation

- B. The Relationship of Scripture and Church Tradition
  - 1. The attributes of Scripture
    - a. Rome = necessary but not authoritative, sufficient and perspicuous
  - 2. Catholicism = Sola ecclesia
    - a. "Partim-partim"
    - b. The Roman Formula = "scripture + tradition + magisterium"
